
CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

National Hospice Palliative Care Week will run from May 4th to 10th, 2014 under the theme, "Busting the Myths about Hospice Palliative Care".

MYTH: Receiving hospice palliative care means you'll die soon.

FACT: Hospice palliative care is not just for the final days or months of life. Its holistic approach includes pain and symptom management, caregiver support, spiritual care, bereavement and much more.

MYTH: Hospice palliative care is just for seniors.

FACT: Hospice palliative care is provided to people of all ages - from infancy to adulthood. As a matter of fact, Canada has six hospices dedicated to pediatric palliative care. Adults in their prime also die, and we need to ensure that they and their families are properly supported and prepared for the end of life, no matter their age.

MYTH: I can only get palliative care in a hospital.

FACT: Palliative care services are offered in many places, including hospitals, long term care facilities, hospices and in your own home.

Speak Up Campaign – Start the conversation about end of life care.

Imagine – one day, without warning, you find yourself in a hospital, unable to communicate. Who would speak for you and make health care decisions for you?


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TEN THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE BRIDGE HOSPICE

- 1) Hospice palliative care means living well with dignity and comfort to the end of life.
- 2) Each resident stays in a private room.
- 3) Residents are offered food and drink on a frequent basis.
- 4) All required meds are administered at The Bridge Hospice.
- 5) Here is no fee for services provided at The Bridge Hospice.
- 6) Care is provided 24/7 by caregivers with the support of the resident's physician, nurses, personal support workers

- and other health care professionals as required.
- 7) Our caregivers have received mandatory hospice palliative care education and are supervised by a registered nurse.
- 8) Visitors are welcome at any time.
- 9) The Bridge Hospice offers complementary therapies for residents.
- 10) The Bridge Hospice receives no government funding. Because of the generosity of our donors, we are mortgage and debt free.


