Mary arrives at The Bridge Hospice and is brought through the front door. Once inside, she knows she's in the right place, and why she chose to spend her last days here. The home-like atmosphere, the comfortable setting, and the presence of caring individuals bring her a sense of relief. She knows she'll be well looked after, and that her family will have extra time to spend together without worrying about her care.

The Bridge Hospice offers an option for people to

live their final days in comfort, serenity and dignity. Located in Warkworth, our facility is Northumberland County's only residential hospice – with the closest being in midtown Toronto to the west and in Bancroft, Madoc and Picton to the east.

To date we have had 25 residents stay with us from across the region: Brighton, Campbellford, Codrington, Hastings, Havelock, Norwood, Trenton and Warkworth.

The Bridge Hospice lightens the heavy load for family caregivers at a time when care needs increase and energy and

emotional resources are scarce.

Care is provided around the clock by a visiting team of professionals (physicians, nurses, personal support workers and others) and our educated volunteer caregivers. There is no cost to residents or their families. We are entirely supported by donations, in memoriams, fundraising events, grants and bequests, and receive no government funding.

Our kitchen is easy to navigate with clearly marked cupboards to help you find cookware, condiments, spices, dishes, cutlery and other kitchen items. Above the sink, a large window looks onto a treed pasture with a revolving cast of cattle, deer, birds and wild turkeys.



For many, the kitchen is the place where new relationships begin. With every resident, our Bridge Hospice community grows. Often family members and friends make return visits, stopping by to share memories over a cup of tea or coffee.
